# I am going to the Academy of Music

The Academy of Music is a venue where musicians from The Philadelphia Orchestra perform.

# Entering the Theater

I can enter the theater through the front entrance or I can use the ramp outside.



# Lobby

When I enter the Academy of Music,  
I will enter into a big lobby.

The lobby might be a bit crowded and noisy.

If I don't like the lobby, I can go to the quiet  
area upstairs near the Ballroom.

# Waiting in Lines

When I go to the Academy of Music,  
I may have to wait in short lines.

I may have to wait in line to pick up a ticket.

I may have to wait in line in the Bathroom.



# Bathrooms

If I have to go to the bathroom,  
I will let my mom or dad know.

I can go to the bathroom any  
time during the performance.

The sound of the flushing toilet can  
be loud but it will only be for a short time.



# Tickets

or get a ticket from the ticket booth  
in the lobby.
